Accountability Grade · **79.3/100**
LOW RISK

The agent scored 79.3/100 (Grade B, LOW risk). Transparency is perfect. Accountability and Data Trust are weakened by absent risk assessment and missing freshness and groundedness checks. Reversibility is the lowest dimension, driven by absent override controls and appeal channel. A profiling override reclassified this agent to Category 1 under DPDP Rules 2025 Rule 14, effective 13 May 2027, raising obligations that are not yet met. No live hiring decisions were taken.

Scope and Methodology

What this report covers

This report covers a single execution of the agent identified on the cover page. The audit assesses the logged actions, decisions, validations, and human checkpoints recorded during that execution against four accountability dimensions: *Transparency*, *Accountability*, *Data Trust*, and *Reversibility*. Each dimension corresponds to a category of regulatory obligation recurring across the frameworks Truveil applies.

How Truveil scores

Truveil's scoring engine is rule-based and deterministic. The same evidence, scored against the same framework, produces the same result every time. Each accountability signal is anchored to specific provisions in primary regulatory text. Caps and floors apply where a binding obligation is unmet, these are not weighted heuristics but explicit thresholds defined in the underlying regulation.

Narrative interpretation in this report is produced by a language model under structured constraints. The model summarises findings already determined by the engine. It does not score, classify, or rank the agent. Citations in this report are restricted to provisions present in the engine's citation index for this run.

Step-by-step execution

01 Agent Registration and AI Disclosure

Agent declared intended purpose and recorded AI disclosure text for candidate-facing communication before screening began.

Finding 1Risk Assessment Not Conducted HIGH

No risk assessment or DPIA reference was logged at registration or during execution, a mandatory control for Category 1 agents.

Finding 2Appeal Channel Not Configured **HIGH**

No appeal channel was present across any log entry, leaving candidates without a documented recourse path as required for Category 1 agents.

Finding 3Override Capability Not Logged **MEDIUM**

No override action was recorded during the run, leaving no demonstrated path for human operators to countermand agent decisions mid-execution.

04 Enforce Freshness Metadata on Input Profiles

Require date fields on all submitted profiles and log a freshness check event at intake, referencing DPDP Rules 2025 Rule 8.

05 Add Groundedness Logging to Assessment Steps

Record a groundedness score or profile-text citation for each criterion finding during candidate assessment to satisfy DPDP Rules 2025 Rule 6.
